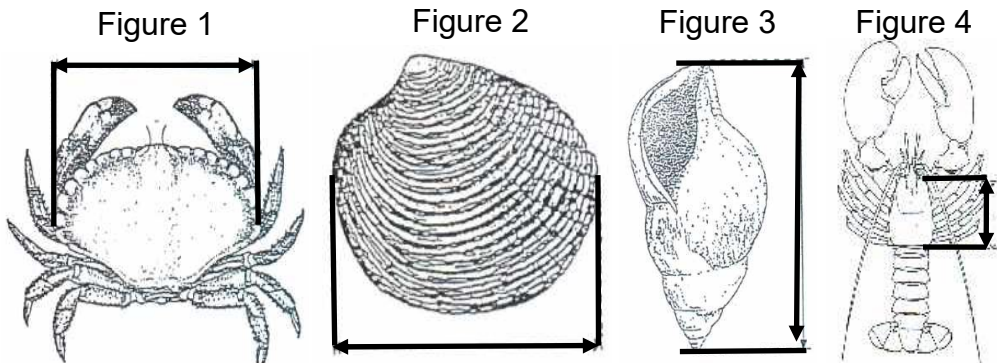

Measurement of a marine organism

The size of a **lobster** shall be measured as the length of the carapace, parallel to the midline, from the back of either eye socket to the distal edge of the carapace. The size of an **edible crab** shall be measured as the maximum width of the carapace measured perpendicular to the antero-posterior midline of the carapace. The size of any **bivalve mollusc** shall be measured across the longest part of the shell. The size of a **whelk** shall be measured as the length of the shell.

Undersize marine organisms

A marine organism is undersize if its dimensions are smaller than the minimum dimensions specified. Undersized marine organisms shall not be retained onboard or be transhipped, landed, stored, sold, displayed or offered for sale, but shall be returned immediately to the sea.

Eastern IFCA Byelaws

Further restrictions, on the fishing for and use of crab and lobster, are **contained in the EIFCA Byelaws** (please visit the website for more details). The minimum size for the velvet crabs is laid down in SI No.919: "The Undersized Velvet Crabs Order 1989".

Regarding Mussels 50mm applies within the EIFCA District, except within the boundaries of the Wash Fishery Order where 45mm applies. Mussel must be **51mm** when landing in the area to the north of the district between Haile Sand Fort and a line drawn true east from the control tower at the Royal Air Force Gunnery and Bombing Range at Donna Nook in Lincolnshire.

Further restrictions apply on the fishing for whelk as per the whelk Permit Byelaw 2016. Please contact the office for details.

Berried Lobsters

British fishing vessels must not fish for berried lobsters (*Homarus gammarus*) or crawfish (*Palinurus elephas* and *Palinurus mauritanicus*) from within English waters. British fishing vessels must not land berried lobsters or crawfish into an English port regardless of where they were caught. Any berried lobsters or crawfish which are brought on board a British fishing vessel within English waters must be returned to the sea immediately. This applies to relevant British fishing vessels, this includes commercial vessels fishing with the authority of an English fishing licence, and unpowered or unlicensed fishing vessels.
