

# First meeting of the Cromer Shoal Chalk Beds MCZ Stakeholder Group: How you can engage with the development of adaptive fisheries management

Our partners from the Marine Conservation Society's Agents of Change project are setting up a Stakeholder Group to enable all interested parties to engage with the Adaptive Risk Management (ARM) approach to fisheries management in the Cromer Shoal Chalk Beds MCZ. The Stakeholder Group will be coordinated by the Agents of Change project and it is envisaged that meetings will cover specific topics themed around Eastern IFCA's ongoing research and management work.

The very first meeting, '*Setting Foundations*', is planned to take place over Zoom on **Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> September between 17:00 and 18:30**.
