

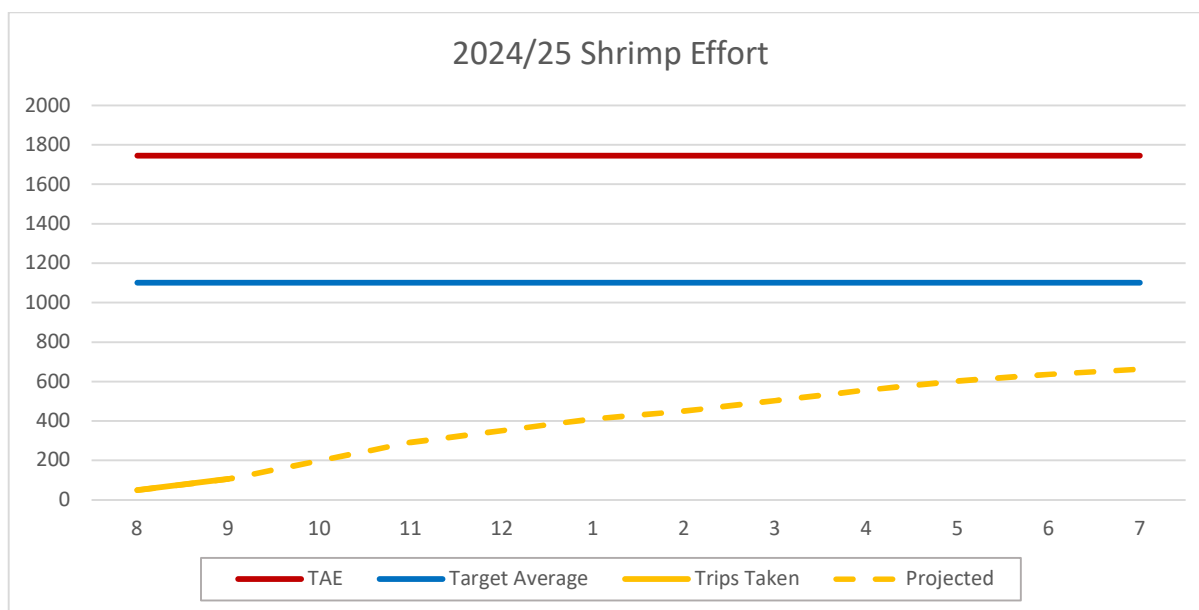
## October Update, Shrimp Permit Year 2024/25

The Shrimp Permit Byelaw 2018 came into force on 31 May 2022, and is intended to enable the Authority to manage shrimp fisheries throughout the district to ensure the fishery operates in a way that does not cause environmental harm.

Within the Wash and North Norfolk Coast SAC (accessed with 'Category 1' permits), this involves a limitation on the number of trips that can be taken a year to prevent damage to the environment. This update explains the number of trips reported so far for the 2023/24 permit year, and how this will affect how many trips will be available in future years.

**Total Allowable Effort:** 1746 Trips

### Trips Taken & Projected:



**Trips Taken (End of September):** 106

**Projected full year trips at current effort:** 663

**Next year's maximum Total Allowable Effort at projected rate:** 1746

**Long term risk:** Low

Effort is currently well below the target average, and while some trips may not yet have been reported, there is significant space for effort to increase before even reaching the target average.
